## **Adopting a Puppy – Checklist Before Adopting**

Pet lovers will always know the importance of adopting a puppy and the responsibilities that come with it. Therefore, it is necessary to go through this checklist with your entire family and make sure everybody agrees on the following points

•	The entire family supports the idea of pet adoption	
•	The owner can take care of the pet for its entire life (10-18 years)	
•	The owner can undertake the pet's costs (veterinary bills, training, etc.)	
•	Owner can give adequate time to his pet	
•	Owner has done proper research before buying a pet	
	Premises	
•	The pet shop is licensed by the National Parks Board (N'Parks) or the Animal & Veterinary Service (AVS) and is allowed to sell puppies. Also, the certificate issued is displayed properly.	
•	Pets are kept in clean places that are well-ventilated	
	Pet shop's Knowledge	
•	The attendant is handling the puppies with care and confidence	
•	The attendant has knowledge about the puppy and its training and grooming	
	Condition of Puppy	
•	The puppy is alert and provides spontaneous response	
•	The puppy is able to move around without any physical disabilities	
•	The puppy does not show any stains of discharge from its eyes, nose and ears	
•	The coat of the puppy is healthy and clean and does not show signs of hair loss	
•	The puppy does not show any signs of allergies and skin infections	
•	The puppy is not affected with bad habits like chewing or mouthing	



## Adopting a Puppy - Checklist Before Adopting

## Regulation

•	The puppy is micro chipped	
•	The puppy has a vaccination card that contains details of microchip number, vaccination, etc.	
•	The owner has undertaken the responsibilities of the dog by filling up the Pet Purchase Declaration Form	
•	The owner has viewed the health card issued by a veterinarian, certifying the pet's health	
	Health and Nutrition	
•	The adopted puppy is 9-12 weeks old and has received two vaccinations from the pet shop	
•	The puppy has rested for a week after its second vaccination	
•	The puppy that is to be adopted was imported at least 6 days ago	
•	The puppy is properly dewormed	

**NOTE:** The listed points are for the owners to follow before buying or adopting a puppy. These guidelines have been made by keeping in mind the health and safety of the animal. Owners can consult their local veterinarian regarding any confusion.
